Welcome to Accrington Stanley Community Trust's 2024 impact report.

The aim of this report is to give you a reflection of the fantastic projects we have been delivering in our community and the positive impact we have made in 2024.

Inside this report you will learn about the new projects and partnerships we have launched, as well as some key information on our well-established provision.

We've had another very successful year at Accrington Stanley Community Trust. We have engaged over 20,000 people from our local community and deliver over 30 varied community projects.

We've invested further capital into our £4m Stanley Sports Hub facility, with the addition of a £200,000 3G Football Cage. This new pitch allows us to further increase our sports provision, as well as providing a great new space for grassroots teams and local community groups.

In January 2024 we were delighted to host the Prime Minister, Rishi Sunak, to Stanley Sports Hub. It was an honour to host the Prime Minister and discuss the valuable work our Charity does in the local community. He also took part in a disability sport session with participants at Stanley Sports Hub.

We secured various pots of funding including a further £25,000 funding from the Premier League to deliver a fan engagement project. We also received funding towards new maintenance machinery so we can continue to improve the pitches at Stanley Sports Hub.

I would like to thank all of our funders, partners, staff and volunteers who have enabled us to achieve our aims and objectives this year. We are actively delivering over 30 community projects which are vital to so many people in our community.

We are looking forward to continuing our progress in 2025, with a focus on growing our provision in education, sport, health and community engagement.

We have delivered some great projects in 2024, this has further enhanced our position of helping our community. It is essential that the community are involved in all of our work, and I am pleased to say that this has been a success over the past 12 months.

The Charity has taken the opportunity to connect with local businesses through developing its corporate responsibilities scheme (CSR). Launching a Business Club membership scheme, providing an ideal way for local businesses to engage its corporate social responsibilities. We've recruited over 30 businesses to the scheme, and hope to grow this further over the coming months.

The Charity has established itself over the past 14 years to become one of the leading organisations of the third sector within Hyndburn. The achievements of this year would not have been possible without the strong partnerships we have in place with a number of local organisations and the staff and volunteers who oversee the projects we deliver to our community.

The Stanley Sports Hub provides the Trust with a fantastic base to deliver over 30 community projects and provide outstanding facilities to sports clubs and residents in Hyndburn. Due to the continued success of the facility, we developed another capital project in 2024, with the addition of a £200,000 3G Football Cage. This is being used for charitable projects, community groups and grassroots teams.

In December 2024, we organised a fundraising event for the Charity to raise funds for a new security fence and additional gates at Stanley Sports Hub. We were very lucky to have former England Cricket Head Coach and Sky Sports Presenter, David Lloyd as a guest speaker, along with Peter Beardsley (ex-England International, Liverpool and Newcastle Footballer) and Marc Pugh (ex-Bournemouth Premier League Footballer) in attendance to support the event.

On behalf of myself and fellow trustees, we are immensely proud to be a part of this fantastic hardworking organisation that makes such a positive difference to thousands of people in our community. With my current business background and experience, I'm looking forward to continuing to develop and raise the profile of Accrington Stanley Community Trust by engaging with businesses, partners and the local community.

Accrington Stanley Community Trust has expanded at a phenomenal rate and we now work in 4 key themed areas: Sports Participation, Education, Health & Wellbeing and Community Engagement.

Football and, in particular, Accrington Stanley Football Club has the ability to engage people, improve community cohesion and raise the hopes and aspirations of the people of Hyndburn. As a Club we are committed to ensuring that we respond to local needs whilst working strategically in line with regional and national agendas. We all recognise that sport can play a prominent role in addressing major issues such as obesity, anti-social behaviour, health, employment and attainment.

Through key partnerships and a robust multi-agency approach, we ensure that we can achieve our aims and objectives effectively and efficiently. Our partnerships work underpins the entire scheme delivery programme and enables us to work strategically within Hyndburn. MEDITERRANEAN WORK EXPERIENCE FOR STANLEY STUDENTS

Students from the Accrington Stanley Community Trust travelled to Italy in March to take part in a work experience placement.

Two members of staff and 13 students embarked on the all-expenses paid trip to Salerno in the south west of Italy, where they took part in a coaching placement at a local junior football club.

The students, who all study a full time college course at the Community Trust's Stanley Sports Hub, had the chance to observe coaches at the club, as well as compare coaching styles and methodologies used, further underpinning the theory they have learnt on their college course.

Alongside their work experience placement, the students had time to immerse themselves in the local and national culture, including day trips to Naples, Pompeii and Rome, as well as an entertaining visit to watch local Serie A side U.S. Salernitana 1919.

You have made all the ladies who attend the hub feel extremely welcome with every session filled with fun and laughter.



Our Kicks project sees us engage with the BAME communities and helps with social integration. We continue to increase engagement figures in this area to help transform lives and create a positive impact.









# FREE SHIRT



Accrington Stanley's extremely popular big Shirt Giveaway headed back to the Wham Stadium in September for the eighth consecutive year, with the club now having handed out nearly 10,000 shirts to local youngsters. Players from the Stanley first team squad handed out replica shirts, as well as goodie bags, to excited Year Three students from 41 local schools, at the Wham Stadium.

Children had the opportunity to visit the ground, meet players and staff, as well as receiving their free Stanley football shirt, featuring shirt sponsors Wham, Accrington Stanley Community Trust, and Sundown Solutions.

Through Stanley's partner for the event, #AmazingAccrington, all pupils visiting the ground also received a goody bag, collated by Official Accrington Stanley Supporters' Trust volunteers, with various other goodies donated by local businesses and club sponsors, with great thanks to What More UK, Accrington Stanley Community Trust, North Lancs Training Group, Sundown Solutions, Refresco, Sawley Fine Arts, Clayton Park Bakery, Spar, and Burnley College.

Contribution towards the cost of coaches to transport all the schools was provided by ClIrs Loraine Cox and Peter Britcliffe from their Lancashire County Council Champions grants, plus Haworths Financial Services, Frasers Group, and Oswaldtwistle Mills.

With the support of schools and businesses across Hyndburn, this programme has now given away almost 10,000 Stanley shirts and goodie bags.

The event is designed to encourage youngsters in the borough to take an interest in sport, get involved in sport, and feel connected to their local professional League Two club.

Commercial Director, Warren Eastham, said: "The shirt giveaway is certainly the best thing we can do as a club. It's fantastic to see local children come here enjoying the Wham Stadium, and getting a feel for a real professional football club. This event means that over the last few years, we've given out over 10,000 shirts. It'll be great to see the kids back here cheering on the Reds as soon as possible."

First Team Manager, John Doolan, added: "This is a fantastic initiative that's been going on now for eight years. It's fantastic for the kids, and the community. "You've got 41 primary schools that come along and you see over 1,200 kids, it's brilliant. The players give the shirts away to the kids, then they go around and get their picture taken. The smile that puts on their faces!"

CEO of iMEP, Eddy O'Brien, said: "As brand new sponsors of the Eric Whalley Family Stand, we are delighted to be involved in the big Shirt Giveaway for the first time. We have admired this initiative from afar for some time and as a local business we can't thank Andy Holt and Accrington Stanley enough for how much this means to the community."



## STANLEY SPORTS HUB

The Stanley Sports Hub is a state of the art £4m community facility developed and operated by Accrington Stanley Community Trust. Situated at Higham Playing Fields on Thorneyholme Road, Accrington, the Stanley Sports Hub provides fantastic indoor and outdoor facilities for many grassroots clubs, sports groups and local organisations as well as being the home of Accrington Stanley Community Trust, an award-winning Charity.

We have transformed Higham Playing Fields into a multipurpose community facility that is friendly and affordable. As well as opportunities to hire sports pitches for your team or group, there is a variety of exciting activities provided for the local community by Accrington Stanley Community Trust.



# OUR STATE OF THE ART £750,000 3G PITCH

The full size 3G floodlit artificial football pitch is located on the lower section of the site and will provide a fantastic playing experience for its users.

The pitch can be split into a variety of playing areas suitable for 5, 7, 9 and 11-aside football. This state-of-the-art pitch will prioritise use on evenings and weekends for local grassroots clubs and community activities.



We have four changing rooms and two officials' rooms available for people to use when hiring our facilities for matches. The changing rooms have a shower area, two separate toilets, a tactics board, large seating area and plug socket for teams who like to listen to music before a match. Our officials' rooms offer a comfortable space for match officials to use before and after a match.



Heading into the new extension we've created a Sports Café which overlooks the 3G pitch and has seating for 32 people. 3 large LCD screens are scattered around showing live sports throughout the day.



The conference room is laid out in a boardroom style and like the meeting rooms can be used for meetings, interviews and training sessions.

There are 2 large 75" LCD screens which can be used for presentations and has Sky TV included alongside free Wi-Fi. There is free on-site parking available.



Through the main entrance is a 28-seat cafeteria and breakout space for participants, parents and the general public to relax and enjoy hot and cold refreshments as well as a sports. Public toilet facilities are included in this section.





Our large modern meeting room caters for up to 12 people and our smaller modern meeting room caters for up to 6 people. The meeting room has a board room layout and is suitable for meetings, interviews and training sessions. Free Wi-Fi and a LCD screen which can be used for presentations is included.

**SEFICE SPACE** 



Accrington Stanley Community Trust's offices are situated in the Stanley Sports Hub. The offices are open Monday-Friday 9am-5pm and are the main headquarters of the Charity. This base helps our Charity plan, devise and manage 30 projects which we deliver to thousands of people in our community each year.





Our adaptable training rooms are a great space for courses, workshops, interviews and meetings. We have four training rooms available for groups of up to 24 people with flexible layout options. The training rooms are both equipped with free Wi-Fi and a large LCD screen for use with laptops and tablets.





Stanley Sports Hub has several quality grass pitches which are suitable for a range of sports as well as a multi-use area. The pitches at Stanley Sports Hub will be taken care of all year round allowing us to get maximum usage from them throughout the year.



The 3G floodlit cage is located at the back of the building and will provide a fantastic playing experience for small sided football. The pitch is fully enclosed and has overhead netting, perfect for 5v5 matches or team training sessions.

Bookings are made on the hour, and evening use will end at 10pm.



Accrington Stanley has become the first EFL club to net a maximum £100,000 grant from the Sky Bet EFL Building Foundations Fund in the latest round of funding awards to boost football community projects across England and Wales.

The Lancashire club with traditions dating back nearly 140 years is one of seven Clubs to receive much-needed cash in the second round of awards since the Sky Bet EFL Building Foundations Fund was launched last season.

Accrington Stanley's Club Community Organisation (CCO) will use the funding to finance a new small-sided 3G pitch at its Stanley Sports Hub facility, a venue that already serves many local grassroots clubs, sports groups and organisations, and is a training venue in the UK and Ireland's successful bid to host the 2028 European Championships.

Construction of the new pitch has already begun and is expected to pave the way for a marked rise in the number of people playing football, from disabled groups to community sessions for over 50s. Other winnings bids included the CCOs run by Rotherham United, Stevenage, Walsall, Crawley Town, Watford and Notts County.

talkSPORT Breakfast Show host and Sky Bet ambassador, Jeff Stelling was one of the panellists who judged winning bids. He said: "There's no doubt that this round of funding will play a crucial role in keeping communities across England and Wales active for years to come.

What has really impressed me when judging these applications is the breadth of different programmes that the CCOs offer, and these new grants will be put to great use serving the whole community."

Accrington Stanley Chairman, Andy Holt said: "Community is key for every football club and this £100,000 grant from the Sky Bet EFL Building Foundations Fund is absolutely massive for the Hyndburn community."

"The new 3G pitch at the Stanley Sports Hub is now fully constructed, and it will mean more groups of every age and ability can use the excellent facilities that the Accrington Stanley Community Trust provide."

Sky Bet and the EFL launched the Building Foundations Fund to support and enhance new and existing community projects when the betting and gaming operator extended its title partnership with the EFL last year. Sky Bet committed to investing a bumper £6 million over six years.

Today's funding awards come after new Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport ,Lisa Nandy MP talked of her ambition to prioritise support for grassroots sport - to help find the stars of tomorrow and transform lives in every part of Britain.

Debbie Cook, Director of EFL in the Community, the EFL's charitable arm, said: "Our Clubs are at the heart of our communities across England and Wales and are serving distinct and diverse local areas. The Sky Bet EFL Building Foundations Fund is enabling and strengthening the role of our network to change people's lives in EFL communities. The fund will continue to support the commitment to and significant impact that facility upgrades, and the delivery of new and existing programmes can create in communities up and down the country."

### NEW 3G CAGE

More than £650,000-worth of funding was awarded by the Sky Bet EFL Building Foundations Fund to more than 60 EFL CCOs in March.

Under the first round of bids, Millwall launched a Military Veterans Football Programme, to reconnect ex-service men and women through free football sessions, while Leeds United used the money to expand its 'Social Goals' programme to tackle isolation among the over 50s.

Dan Colton, Managing Director of Sky Bet said: "We all celebrated the England team's progress to the final of the Euros in Germany, but the Building Foundations Fund is about providing much needed support at the other end of the ladder - the communities around the 72 great clubs in the EFL.

"We're incredibly proud of the impact the Building Foundations Fund is already having all over England and Wales and the calibre of the many applications from CCOs in this round of funding reinforces what vital services these organisations provide and how important it is they have the infrastructure they need to thrive."

EFL CCOs will have further opportunity to bid for funding grants throughout the upcoming season that will contribute to improving local sporting facilities or promoting the physical and social benefits of the game.

# TRUST AWARDED £100,000 FROM THE ARMED FORCES COVENANT FUND

Accrington Stanley Community Trust are delighted to have been awarded £100,000 funding from the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust's Reaching and Supporting Armed Forces programme.

The funding will be used to deliver the Armed Forces project in Hyndburn, based at the £4m Stanley Sports Hub.

A new 3-year funded Veterans Support Hub project will provide regular access to sport and physical activity alongside social activities as with our existing veterans support programme, however we will then work with each individual beneficiary to develop a personalised support programme which will see us put in place strategies to help that person to deal with their own issues with addiction, whether that be from substances, alcohol or gambling or a combination of all three.



# TRUST AWARDED £100,000 FROM SKY BET EFL BUILDING FOUNDATIONS FUND

The Accrington Stanley Community Trust have been awarded a £100,000 grant from the Sky Bet EFL Building Foundations Fund for the newly-constructed 3G pitch at the Stanley Sports Hub, meaning more groups of every age and ability can now use the excellent facilities!

Seven EFL club community organisations have received a grant in the second phase of funding, which aims to improve the quality of life within communities through the access to, and quality of, football provisions and initiatives.



### TRUST CELEBRATE £24,000 MACHINERY FUNDING SUCCESS

Accrington Stanley Community Trust has been awarded a grant of £24,000 from the Premier League, The FA and Government's Football Foundation to improve grass pitches in Hyndburn.

The grant has contributed towards the cost of a brand new £32,000 compact tractor to help maintain the grass pitches at the £3.5m Stanley Sports Hub.





## BY THE PREMIER LEAGUE

Accrington Stanley Community Trust, supported by the Premier League Fans Fund, received a further grant of £25,000.

The Premier League Fans Fund provides grants to support football clubs at all levels of the game to strengthen connections between them, their fans, and local communities.

The fund supports a range of fan-focused and fanled projects, helping to foster a sense of belonging through meaningful engagement. This includes schemes for under-represented groups, to further develop an inclusive and welcoming matchday experience for everyone.

The project will use the reach and appeal of Accrington Stanley to engage predominantly with local women and girls in our community, as we look to increase the fan base.

Martin Fearon said: "We're delighted to be launching this new project, funded by the Premier League Fans Fund. The project will see us further strengthen the links between fans and the club, helping diversify the fan base by increasing the number of women and girls' supporters, not just at football matches but in the local community engaging in Accrington Stanley activity."



### TRUST RECEIVE TRUST GETS A £25,000 SUPPORTED BRIGHTER FUTURE AS **FLOODLIGHTS INCREASE COMMUNITY PLAY TIME**



Accrington Stanley Community Trust has invested a further £30,000 at Stanley Sports Hub to upgrade to new LED Floodlights on the 3G Pitch.

After securing a grant for 70% of the costs from the Premier League, The FA and Government's Football Foundation, the new floodlights will improve energy efficiency environment.


